

Sports Premium

The government is providing an additional funding of £150 million per annum to improve the provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding – provided jointly by the Department for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport has been allocated to primary schools.

This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools. Funding for schools has been calculated in reference to the number of primary-aged pupils (between ages of 5 and 11 years), as recorded in the annual schools census in January 2016.
